## THE COACHES

**MIKE TOMLIN** was named the 16<sup>th</sup> head coach in Pittsburgh Steelers history on Jan. 22, 2007. Hired at the age of 34, Tomlin became only the third head coach hired by the Steelers since 1969.

Tomlin became the youngest head coach in NFL history to both coach in and win a Super Bowl when he led the Steelers to a 27-23 victory over the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. By winning the Super Bowl in only his second season as a head coach, he also became the fastest to win a Super Bowl title in Steelers history.

Tomlin is one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach.

Tomlin compiled a 43-21 record in the regular season during his first four years as head coach. His .672 winning percentage after four seasons tied for first in team history. By leading the Steelers to a 12-4 record in 2010, Tomlin became only the second Steelers' head coach to post winning records in each of his first four seasons.

The Steelers' offense ranked 14<sup>th</sup> in the NFL (14<sup>th</sup> passing, 11<sup>th</sup> rushing) despite playing its first four games without its starting quarterback, Ben Roethlisberger. Pittsburgh's defense ranked second in the NFL (first vs. run, 12<sup>th</sup> vs. pass) while leading the NFL with 48 quarterback sacks. The Steelers set a team record and led the NFL, allowing only 62.8 rushing yards per game.

The Steelers continued to be dominant at Heinz Field under Tomlin in 2010. Pittsburgh finished with a 5-3 home record in 2010 after finishing 7-1 (2007), 6-2 (2008) and 6-2 (2009) at home during Tomlin's first three seasons. Tomlin's 24-8 record and .750 winning percentage at home after four seasons ranks second in Steelers' history.

Tomlin was a three-year starter at wide receiver at William and Mary (1990-94) and finished his career with 101 receptions for 2,046 yards and a school-record 20 TD catches. A first-team All-Yankee Conference selection in 1994, he established a school record with a 20.2 yards-per-catch average.

Tomlin was the NFL's second-youngest head coach in 2007, and he became only the second Steelers coach in team history to win at least 10 games during his first year at the helm. The Steelers posted a 7-1 record at home in 2007 and were 5-1 in the AFC North (3-0 at home).

Tomlin became only the second Steelers head coach to win his first three games. During 2007, the Steelers became just the fifth team in NFL history to win their first four home games by at least 20 points.

The Steelers' defense was dominant under Tomlin's guidance in 2008, leading the NFL in total defense (237.2), pass defense (156.9), points per game (13.9), total yards per play (3.9), rushing yards per attempt (3.3), passing yards per attempt (4.7) and third down efficiency (31.4), and finished second in league rushing defense (80.3).

Tomlin led the Steelers to a 10-6 record in 2007, and became just the second coach in team history to post a winning record, win a division title and earn a playoff berth in his inaugural season.

**MARVIN LEWIS** is in his ninth season as Bengals head coach — the longest tenure in franchise history.

Lewis led the Bengals to a 10-6 record and the AFC North Division championship in 2009. He earned the major share of Coach of the Year awards, winning the flagship Associated Press honor (given annually since 1957) while also getting nods from *Sports Illustrated* and *Pro Football Weekly*/Pro Football Writers Association. The Bengals were unbeaten in division play (6-0) for the first time in franchise history.



## STEELERS RADIO COVERAGE

For the 13th consecutive year, WDVE-FM (102.5) and WBGG-AM (970) are carrying all Steelers games.

Additionally, Steelers games can be heard on a 47-station network spanning Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio and Maryland. For the second straight year, all Steelers' games will be broadcast in Spanish on Estadio W (730 AM).

For the 17th straight season, Bill Hillgrove serves as the "Voice of the Steelers" and handles play-by-play duties for the broadcast. Joining Hillgrove for his 13th season as an expert analyst is Tunch Ilkin, the former Steelers All-Pro offensive tackle. Joining the team for his ninth season is former Steeler offensive lineman Craig Wolfley, who provides sideline analysis.

#### Pittsburgh Team Notes:

- The Steelers are now 330-208 all-time against AFC opponents.
- Pittsburgh has won eight of its last 10 games.
- The Steelers registered their first win in Kansas City since 10/14/01 (20-17).
- Pittsburgh improved to 18-9 versus the Chiefs and 10-5 at Arrowhead Stadium during the regular season.
- The Steelers recorded 100+ rushing yards (108 on 28 carries) for the second week in a row and the sixth time this season, improving to 5-1 in those contests.
- The Steelers recorded their four takeaways (three interceptions, one fumble recovery), giving them six in the last two games. Prior to the last two games, Pittsburgh had six takeaways in the first nine games.
- The Steelers registered three interceptions for the first time since 1/2/11 at Cleveland.
- Pittsburgh held Kansas City to 90 yards rushing on 34 carries (2.6 avg.). The Steelers have now held four of their last five opponents, and seventh overall, to under 100 net rushing yards.
- For the 10th consecutive game the Steelers defense held their opponent to 23 points or less (0, 20, 17, 17, 13, 20, 17, 23, 17, 9).
- The Steelers held the Chiefs to 74 net passing yards in the first half, marking the seventh time this season Pittsburgh held their opponents to less than 80 net passing yards in the first half.

#### Pittsburgh Individual Notes:

##### Head Coach Mike Tomlin

- Improved to 23-15 on the road during the regular season.
- For the fourth time in five years as the Steelers head coach, Mike Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to an 8-3 record in its first 11 games (2007, '08, '10).

#### PITTSBURGH TEAM NOTES

#### PITTSBURGH INDIVIDUAL NOTES

##### Head Coach Mike Tomlin

- With a win will become only the sixth head coach in NFL history to win at least nine games in each of his first five seasons since the NFL merger in 1970. Tomlin will join George Seifert, Mike Holmgren, Bill Cowher, Chuck Knox and Mike Sherman.
- Is one win away from becoming the second head coach in Steelers history to post a winning record in each of his first five seasons (Bill Cowher).
- Needs one win to pass Buddy Parker (51-47, 1957-64) for the third most regular-season wins by a Steelers head coach.
- Will look to improve to 8-2 against Cincinnati, including 4-1 at home, and sweep the Bengals for the fourth time in five seasons as head coach.
- With a win will improve to 20-8 against teams in the AFC North.
- Will look to improve to 52-24 overall and 29-9 at home during the regular season.

##### QB Ben Roethlisberger

- Looks to throw for at least 300 yards for the fourth time in the last six games. Would mark the 20th 300-yard passing performance of Roethlisberger's career and the fifth of this season, tying a career-high for 300+ passing games during the regular season (five in 2009).
- Looks for fourth 100.0+ rating of the season and 45th of his career.
- Needs five completions to reach 250 completions on the season, extending his franchise record of seasons with 250+ completions to five (2006-09).
- With a win will improve to 12-4 against the Bengals.
- Will look to improve to 78-32 as a starter and 43-13 at home.
- With a win will be 31-9 against the AFC North, including 16-5 at home.

## LOOKING AHEAD...

The Steelers stay at home to host the Cleveland Browns on Thursday, Dec. 8, at Heinz Field. Kickoff is set for 8:20 p.m. and will be televised on the NFL Network (locally KDKA-TV, channel 2).

### WR Hines Ward

- Needs nine receiving yards to reach 12,000 for his career. He would be 19<sup>th</sup> player in NFL history to reach the mark and the first in Steelers' history. Ward will become the third player in NFL history to reach 12,000 career receiving yards and win multiple Super Bowls (Hall of Famers Jerry Rice and Art Monk).

### TE Heath Miller

- Is 118 yards shy of passing Santonio Holmes (3,835) for ninth place on the Steelers all-time receiving yards list.
- Needs five receptions to surpass Elbie Nickel (329) for the most receptions by a tight end in Steelers history.

### WR Antonio Brown

- Will look to lead the Steelers in either receptions or receiving yards for the fifth consecutive game.

### RB Rashard Mendenhall

- Needs one rushing touchdown to pass John Henry Johnson and Barry Foster (26) for the fifth-most in team history.
- Is 103 yards away from passing Merril Hoge (3,115) for the 11th most career rushing yards in franchise history.

- After returning a fumble 16 yards for the second fumble returned for a touchdown of his career vs. Indianapolis (Week 3), is one away from tying Jason Gildon (3) for the most fumbles returned for touchdowns in franchise history.
- Needs one touchdown to move into a tie for the second-most defensive touchdowns in Steelers history:

## TEAM NOTES

**Toughest Division?:** The AFC North is the only division to have two teams with at least eight wins. It is one of only two divisions (NFC North) in the NFL to have three teams with at least seven victories. It is also one of only two divisions (AFC West) that all four teams have at least four wins. The AFC North is tied for first in the NFL for most wins as a division (27), and it is tied for first (NFC North) for the highest winning percentage (.613) of any division in the NFL.

The AFC North has given up the fewest points allowed as a division (801), and all four teams are in the top-10 in the NFL in total defense. The AFC North also boasts three top-5 pass defenses (Cleveland 1, Pittsburgh 3, Baltimore 5) and three top-10 rush defenses in the NFL (Baltimore 3, Cincinnati 5, Pittsburgh 6).

The AFC North is also one of only two divisions (NFC South) to have at least six wins against non-conference opponents. Since 2008, the AFC North has had two teams in the playoffs each year.

**Ground Success:** Over the past two weeks the Steelers have controlled the clock for over 33 minutes in each game by registering at least 28 carries and over 100 yards rushing in each (108 on 28 carries at Kansas City / 105 yards on 30 carries at Cincinnati). The Steelers have now recorded at least 28 carries in seven games this season, winning all seven.

Against New England in Week 8, the Steelers totaled 98 yards on 23 carries (4.3 avg.), helping the offense control the ball for 39:22, the highest T.O.P. by the Steelers in a non-overtime game since 10/4/09 vs. San Diego (40:20). In Week 7 at Arizona the Steelers recorded 91 rushing yards on 28 carries, and controlled the ball for 35:47. In six of the past seven games, Pittsburgh has out-rushed their opponent.

In Weeks 5 and 6, the Steelers recorded 174 and 185 rushing yards, marking the first time Pittsburgh reached at least 160 rushing yards in back-to-back games since 2010 (162, 11/21/10 vs. Oak and 206, 11/28/10 at Buf).

The Steelers have achieved success on the ground despite having a number of injuries to the offensive line since the start of the 2010 season. Last season the Steelers started five different combinations on the offensive line and so far in 2011 Pittsburgh has used a different starting offensive line combination in six of 10 games.

This season Pittsburgh has also had to use a number of running backs due to injuries, four different Steelers have over 105 rushing yards through 11 games and two have eclipsed 260 yards (**RB Rashard Mendenhall**, 574/**RB Isaac Redman**, 267).

**Limiting QBs:** Pittsburgh has faced 11 different quarterbacks this season, holding six to a passer rating lower than 73.0.

Over the last two games Pittsburgh's defense has recorded five interceptions by five different players (**Lawrence Timmons** and **William Gay** at Cincinnati, and **Ike Taylor**, **Ryan Mundy** and **Keenan Lewis** at Kansas City).

The Steelers have also only allowed one quarterback to throw for 300 yards and have held eight under 200 yards. The only quarterback to throw for 300 yards on the Steelers this season was Joe Flacco and he attempted 47 passes, completing 28 to get to 300 yards in Week 9. The Steelers limited Tom Brady to 198 passing yards, after he averaged 360.5 though his first six games

this season. It was the first time Brady was held under 200 yards in 2011.

**Tough In The Air:** This season has seen an unprecedented number of 300-yard passing games throughout the NFL. The Steelers third-ranked pass defense has held six teams under 175 net passing yards, winning five of those games. Pittsburgh is also tied for giving up the third fewest pass plays of 25+ yards (15) this season.

In three of the past four games the Steelers have held their opponents to 170 net passing yards or less (NE, Cin, KC).

In Week 5, the Steelers' limited the Jacksonville offense to 76 net passing yards. Pittsburgh only gave up 10 net passing yards in the first two quarters, which is the fifth-fewest net passing yards allowed by Pittsburgh's defense in the first half, dating back to 1991.

Since the start of the 2007 season, Pittsburgh's defense has allowed only 84 passing touchdowns, tied for the second fewest in the NFL over that time span (Indianapolis Colts, 82 and New York Jets, 84).

**Difficult Stretch:** Pittsburgh is wrapping up a five-game stretch where they played two teams that are in first place in their division (NE, BAL) and another twice (CIN) that is one game back.

In Week 8 the Steelers handed New England their second loss of the season. In Week 9 Pittsburgh lost by three in the final seconds to the then 6-2 Ravens. In Week 10 the Steelers beat Cincinnati, ending its five-game winning streak, and will play the Bengals again this week. In Week 12 the Steelers traveled to the always tough Arrowhead Stadium to face Kansas City and came out with a 13-9 victory.

Things don't get any easier after the five-game stretch as the Steelers will play divisional foe Cleveland at home on a Thursday night before traveling across the country to play 9-2 San Francisco on Monday Night Football.

**If You Build It, They Will Come:** The Steelers registered three of the top-10 all-time attendance records for a single game during the 2010 season, including the single-game record.

In the 2010 AFC Championship victory over the N.Y. Jets, the Steelers broke the single-game record. The attendance of 66,662 surpassed the old mark of 65,597 set October 25, 2009, during a game versus the Minnesota Vikings.

The previous regular-season record was 65,392, which was set on November 16, 2009 versus Cincinnati.

Pittsburgh set the team home attendance record in 2009 by averaging 63,458 (507,882 total).

Pittsburgh has sold out 305 straight games at home, dating back to Nov. 5, 1972 versus Cincinnati.

**Heinz Field Advantage:** The Steelers own the best home record in the NFL with a 231-89-1 record (.721) since 1970. Pittsburgh is 46-15 (.754) at home over the past seven seasons, including a 4-1 record in 2011. This season marked the third time in the past five seasons that the Steelers opened 4-0 at home.

Pittsburgh finished the 2004 regular season with an undefeated (8-0) home record for only the third time in team history and for the first time in 25 years.

The Steelers finished the 1979 regular season with an undefeated home record (8-0) and eventually won Super Bowl XIV. The Steelers were also undefeated at home (7-0) in 1972.

**Turning Up the Heat:** Pittsburgh has registered 24 sacks in 2011. The Steelers have registered 19 of the 24 sacks at Heinz Field to tie for second in the NFL for sacks at home.

**LB James Harrison** registered all three of Pittsburgh's sacks against Baltimore in Week 9, his fourth career game with at least three sacks and first since 10/11/09 versus Detroit.

In Week 6 versus Jacksonville, Pittsburgh registered four of its five sacks in the first half, marking the 16<sup>th</sup> time since 1991 and the first time since 11/3/08 vs. Washington (4) that the Steelers recorded at least four sacks in the first half.

The Steelers recorded five sacks in Week 2 versus Seattle, tying for the third highest single-game total of the **Mike Tomlin** era and the most since registering six versus Oakland on 11/21/10.

On the road the Steelers have recorded sacks at key times. Against Arizona in Week 7 **LB LaMarr Woodley** recorded a sack on third-and-seven at the PIT 45-yard line that forced a punt. Woodley also forced Cardinals QB Kevin Kolb into an intentional grounding penalty in the end zone that resulted in a safety.

In Week 3 versus Indianapolis, Harrison forced a fumble on a sack of Curtis Painter that **S Troy Polamalu** returned 16 yards for a touchdown to give Pittsburgh a 20-13 lead in the fourth quarter.

Since 1994, the Steelers have led the AFC in sacks six times and the entire NFL three times, including in 2010. Since 2004, the Steelers have the most sacks in the NFL with 332, 18 more than the second place team (New York Giants, 314).

Sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982, however, a record of "passers tackled" was kept prior to that time. Following are the Steelers' single-season sack totals dating back to 1970:

**Safety First:** In Weeks 7 and 8 the Steelers defense registered two safeties: in Week 7 **LB LaMarr Woodley** forced QB Kevin Kolb into an intentional grounding penalty in the end zone and in Week 8 **DE Brett Keisel** stripped the ball from QB Tom Brady in the closing seconds and it rolled out of the end zone.

Dating back to 1960, this was the first time that the Steelers registered safeties in back-to-back weeks. The last team in the NFL to register safeties in back-to-back games was the New York Giants in 2008. It is only the third time since 1960 that Pittsburgh registered two safeties in one season (1962, 1980).

**Defensive Dominance:** The Steelers have given up 17.1 points per game in 2011 to rank fourth in the NFL. In five home games the Steelers have allowed a total of 70 points, giving up 14.0 points per game at home, tied for the second lowest in the NFL.

Since **Dick LeBeau** has been defensive coordinator (2004-present) the Steelers have allowed an average of 16.0 points per game at Heinz Field, ranking second in the NFL over that time span for points given up at home during the regular season (Baltimore, 14.9).

The Steelers have allowed the fewest points in the NFL since the beginning of the 2007 season. Pittsburgh has allowed just 1,236 points during that span (16.5 per game).

**Controlling The NFC:** After beating Arizona and Seattle in 2011, the Steelers have won 25 of their past 30 regular-season games versus teams in the NFC, dating back to 2003.

The Steelers are 99-58-1 all-time against the NFC, including 56-19-1 at home. Pittsburgh has won seven of there last eight games against NFC opponents.

The Steelers have reeled off six consecutive home victories versus NFC teams. Pittsburgh last lost to an NFC team at Heinz Field in 2008 (21-14, vs. New York Giants). Prior to losing to the Giants, Pittsburgh had won eight straight games versus NFC teams at home. The Steelers are 6-2 versus the NFC in the Super Bowl.

**Defense! Defense! Defense!:** Pittsburgh shut out the Seattle Seahawks in Week 2, 24-0. It marked the fourth shutout during the Mike Tomlin era and the first since 12/28/08 (31-0, vs. Cleveland). It marked the 28th shutout for the Steelers since 1960, which is the second most in the NFL during that time span:

**In the Red Zone:** Over the past six games the Steelers are 24-for-26 in the red zone, coming away with 14 touchdowns and 10 field goals. In Week 10 at Cincinnati Pittsburgh was 4-4 in the red zone, coming away with a touchdown three times.

Pittsburgh was 5-for-5 in both Week 8 versus New England and in Week 5 against Tennessee. The performance against the Titans marked only the second time since the start of the 2010 regular season that the Steelers recorded four touchdowns in the red zone (4 TDs, at Cleveland, 1/2/11).

## COACHING NOTES

**First 75:** Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** coached his 75th regular season game as head coach of the Steelers with a 13-9 victory over Kansas City in Week 12. The win marked the 51st regular-season win of Tomlin's head coaching career, tying Bill Cowher for the most wins by a Steelers head coach in their first 75 games.

**Nine Times:** Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** became only the seventh head coach to win at least nine games in each of his first four seasons since the NFL merger in 1970.

Tomlin joined George Seifert, Mike Holmgren, Bill Cowher, Chuck Knox, Mike Sherman and John Robinson.

With one more win Tomlin will become the sixth head coach in NFL history to win at least nine games in each of his first five seasons (Seifert, Holmgren, Cowher, Knox and Sherman)

**In Control:** Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** owns an 19-8 all-time mark against teams in the AFC North.

Tomlin owns an impressive 10-3 record against divisional foes at Heinz Field.

**Primetime Specialist:** With a 13-9 victory over Kansas City on Sunday Night Football in Week 12, Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** improved to 17-6 overall in primetime games, including an 9-3 record on the road. He is 6-0 on Monday Night Football, 7-5 on Sunday Night Football and 4-1 on Thursday Night Football.

Tomlin joined only Bill Cowher (Steelers), Tom Flores (Raiders), Steve Mariucci (49ers), George Siefert (49ers) and Don Shula (Colts, Dolphins) as coaches to win their first six Monday Night Football games.

**Bye Week:** Since 2007 the Steelers have been 4-1 in games following the bye week under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**. The only time Pittsburgh lost after the bye was in 2007, losing 31-28 at Denver. The Steelers have also performed well going into the bye week since Tomlin was named head coach, going 4-1 in those contests, including a 24-17 victory in Week 10 at Cincinnati.

**Strong Out Of The Gate:** Head Coach Mike Tomlin has led the Steelers to a 8-3 record this season, marking the fourth time in the last five seasons that the Steelers have recorded a 8-3 record in the first 11 games. Tomlin is the only head coach in Steelers' history to lead his team to at least eight wins through the first 11 games in four of his first five seasons.

The Steelers started 6-2 for the fifth consecutive season under Tomlin. He became the only coach in Steelers history and in the NFL (since 1978) to open each of his first five seasons with at least six wins through the first eight games.

This season marked the 14th time since 1978 that Pittsburgh has opened the season with at least six wins in their first eight games. In 13 of those cases the Steelers went on to make the playoffs.

Pittsburgh won their first four home games for the third time in five seasons under Tomlin.

In Week 2, Pittsburgh won its fifth straight home opener under Tomlin. He is the only Steelers head coach to win his first five home openers.

Under Tomlin the Steelers are 14-5 (.737) in the month of October, the third best winning percentage in the NFL in October since 2007 (New England, .857; New York Giants, .800).

Pittsburgh has followed October up with success in November, going 12-7 during the month since 2007, including 1-1 this season.

**Our House:** Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** owns a 28-9 regular-season record at Heinz Field in his five seasons in Pittsburgh.

For the third time in Tomlin's five seasons, the Steelers started 4-0 at home this season.

**Tomlin Versus the NFC:** Following Week 7's victory over the Arizona Cardinals, Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** improved his regular-season record to 13-5 against NFC teams in his fifth season at the helm of the Steelers.

The Steelers .722 regular-season winning percentage against the NFC since 2007 is the third best in the NFL.

**Few And Far Between:** Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** became only the second coach in Steelers' history to post winning records in each of his first four seasons. Tomlin is the only coach in team history to win division titles in each of his first two seasons (2007-08).

In 2007, Tomlin became the second head coach in team history to post a winning record in his first season with a mark of 10-6.

**High Honor Roll:** Defensive coordinator **Dick LeBeau** was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August of 2010. LeBeau had an outstanding NFL career, finishing with 62 career interceptions (seventh all-time) and 171 consecutive starts (then-NFL record for a cornerback) with the Detroit Lions.

LeBeau was also inducted into the Ohio State University Hall of Fame in 2009. He played at Ohio State as a cornerback and halfback and was a member of the 1957 national championship team.

**Defensive Mastermind:** The Steelers defense has been led by defensive coordinator **Dick LeBeau** since 2004. During that time span it has been regarded as one of the top defenses in the NFL, helping to lead the Steelers to three Super Bowls. **Controlling The North:** With a victory at Cincinnati in Week 10 **QB Ben Roethlisberger** improved to 30-9 (.769) record as a starter against AFC North opponents during his career with the Steelers. He finished a perfect 5-0 in 2010 against divisional foes.

Roethlisberger had won 12 straight games against divisional foes as the starter prior to the Week 3 setback at Cincinnati in 2009, which was the longest streak in the NFL and the longest since Peyton Manning won 12 straight from 2004-06.

In his 38 career games versus division opponents, Roethlisberger has posted a perfect passer rating once (11/5/07 vs. Baltimore) and has recorded a passer rating of over 100.0 a total of 14 times.

**Home Cooking: QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns a 42-13 (.764) mark in the regular season in his career at Heinz Field, including winning his first eight starts as a rookie in 2004.

At Heinz Field, Roethlisberger has completed 63.1 percent of his passes for 13,239 with 82 touchdowns and 45 interceptions for a passer rating of 94.1. He has thrown for more than 300 yards 11 times and has 24 multi-touchdown games at home (19-5 record in such games), including a franchise and career high (tied) five touchdowns versus the Titans in Week 5.

Roethlisberger has twice posted a perfect passer rating at home, including most recently in Week 9 of 2007 against Baltimore. He also had a perfect passer rating (158.3) against Tennessee in the 2005 season opener and has posted at least a 125.0 passer rating seven times.

The Steelers have scored at least 20 points in 45 of the 55 games at home with Roethlisberger as the starter.

**300-Yard Plateau: QB Ben Roethlisberger** registered over 300 yards passing in a franchise-best three consecutive games (Weeks 7-9).

In Weeks 7 and 8 Roethlisberger became the first Steelers' quarterback to register at least 360 passing yards in back-to-back games (361, 365). He is one of five quarterbacks (Drew Brees, Tom Brady, Phillip Rivers, Cam Newton) to throw for at least 360 yards three times this season. For his career, Roethlisberger has thrown for at least 360 yards, a franchise best, 10 times.

Roethlisberger has now thrown for at least 300 yards four times this season and the 19 times in his career, a team record. The Steelers have won six of the last eight games where Roethlisberger has thrown for 300 yards.

**Quick Start: QB Ben Roethlisberger** has a passer rating of 100.3 in the first half of games in 2011 to rank seventh in the NFL. He has completed 135-of-209 pass attempts for 1,667 yards, 12 touchdowns and four interceptions in the first half of the first 11 games this season. Roethlisberger has totaled over 100 yards passing in 10 of 11 first halves this season including 231 yards passing twice (at Ind, vs. NE).

In Week 7 versus Arizona, he registered a first-half passer rating of 140.4 by completing 9-of-16 passes for 199 yards and two touchdowns. Roethlisberger followed that up by completing a first half career-high 23-of-32 passes for 231 yards, the fifth highest passing yardage total of his career in the first half, with two touchdowns and one interception.

Over the last six games Roethlisberger has led the Steelers offense to points on 20-of-35 first-half possessions (12 TDs, eight FGs), including scoring a touchdown on the opening drive in five of the last seven games. In Week 10 at Cincinnati Roethlisberger led the Steelers to touchdowns on their first two possessions for the third time this season (vs. Ten, vs. Jac)

In Week 5 against Tennessee, Roethlisberger recorded three touchdown passes in the first half. It marked the fourth time in his career he totaled at least four touchdown passes in the first half and was only the sixth time since 1991 that a Steelers quarterback achieved the feat.

Roethlisberger completed 7-of-11 passes for 171 yards and one touchdown for a 137.5 passer rating in the first quarter against the Colts in Week 3. The 171 yards were the most yards he has thrown for in the first quarter during his career. Dating back to 1991, it was the highest first-quarter passing total of any Steelers' quarterback.

**A Good Month:** With the victory against the New England Patriots (Week 8), the Steelers, led by **QB Ben Roethlisberger**, went 4-1 in the month of October. Roethlisberger is now 22-7 in the month of October. The 22 wins are the most for him in any month. Among active quarterbacks Roethlisberger's 102.7 career passer rating in October is second best among active quarterbacks (Aaron Rodgers, 107.5).

Compared to September, November, December and January Roethlisberger has recorded the following career-highs in the month of October: attempts (837), completions (562), completion percentage (67.1), passing yards (7,042), TDs (54), yards per attempt (8.41) and QB rating (102.7).

**Finding The End Zone: QB Ben Roethlisberger** recorded the 20th game of his career with at least three touchdown passes in Week 7 at Arizona. In the Steelers last six games, in which Pittsburgh is 5-1, Roethlisberger has thrown for 13 touchdowns and four interceptions.

He tied a career high with five touchdown passes in Week 5 against Tennessee. It was the fourth time in his career he threw at least four touchdown passes in one game and only the second time he totaled five (11/5/07 at Baltimore). Roethlisberger is the only Steelers quarterback to throw for a franchise-best five touchdowns in a single game twice during the regular season:

**Facing The NFC:** With a career record of 77-32 as a starter, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted gaudy numbers no matter the opposition.

Throughout his career, Roethlisberger has feasted on competition from the NFC. In two games against the NFC this season, victories over Seattle and Arizona, he is 48-of-69 (69.6) for 659 yards with four touchdowns, zero interceptions and a passer rating of 119.2.

In 27 career regular-season games against NFC opponents, Roethlisberger has posted a 21-6 record while completing 432-of-698 passes (61.9 pct.) for 5,900 yards with 37 touchdowns and 17 interceptions for a passer rating of 96.4.

Roethlisberger's statistics against the NFC are equally impressive in games at Heinz Field. In 14 career games against NFC opponents at home, Roethlisberger has a 13-1 mark while completing 217-of-365 passes (59.5 pct.) for 3,139 yards with 18 touchdowns and eight interceptions for a passer rating of 94.8.

Roethlisberger won his first seven starts against NFC teams.

**Title Man: QB Ben Roethlisberger** has led the Steelers to the AFC Championship Game four times in his first seven seasons. He is one of only two active NFL quarterbacks to win multiple Super Bowl titles (Tom Brady).

Roethlisberger joined Roger Staubach, Bernie Kosar, Tom Brady and Donovan McNabb as the only quarterbacks to lead their teams to the conference title game at least three times in their first five seasons as the starting quarterback.

**Starting In Style:** In his career, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns a 77-32 (.706) record as a starting quarterback in the regular season. That mark is the second-best record in the NFL among all active quarterbacks (min. 50 starts).

Roethlisberger reached 75 wins in 106 starts, making him the fourth-fastest quarterback to reach 75 victories among QBs who began their careers in the Super Bowl era, trailing Pro Football Hall of Famer Roger Staubach (99), Tom Brady (99) and Ken Stabler (105).

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranks third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only

**Passing Perfection: QB Ben Roethlisberger** has achieved a number of outstanding single-season accomplishments in his eight-year career, including achieving a feat three times that is rarely done in the NFL.

Roethlisberger, who set the team's single-season mark for passer rating (104.1) in 2007, has had a perfect passer rating (158.3) three times in his career, tying him with QB Peyton Manning for the most in NFL history (minimum 10 attempts).

Roethlisberger's 44 career 100-plus passer rating games in the regular season rank first in team history, surpassing Terry Bradshaw, who had 31 such games since the passer rating rule was implemented in 1973.

**Taking Care of the Ball: QB Ben Roethlisberger** completed 8-of-15 passes against Baltimore in Week 1 before throwing an interception early in the third quarter, ending his career-best streak of not throwing an interception in 173 consecutive passes. His interception streak started on December 5, 2010, at Baltimore.

**Deadly Combination:** Through 11 games in 2011, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **WR Mike Wallace** have hooked up for 939 yards on 55 receptions with six touchdowns.

The two have combined for 11 touchdowns of at least 40 yards since the start of 2009, which ranks first in team history and is the second-most amongst active players in the NFL (12, Peyton Manning and Reggie Wayne).

Through 11 games in 2011, Roethlisberger and Wallace have recorded three touchdowns of at least 40 yards. In Week 7 at Arizona, Roethlisberger and Wallace connected on a 95-yard touchdown, the longest pass play and second longest offensive play from scrimmage in Steelers history. In Week 5 versus Tennessee, Roethlisberger and Wallace connected on a 40-yard touchdown pass. In Week 3 at Indianapolis the two recorded an 81-yard touchdown, marking the fourth-longest pass of Roethlisberger's career and the second longest reception for Wallace. **Moving Up: WR Hines Ward** moved passed Hall of Fame WR Michael Irvin (11,904) into 19th place in NFL history in receiving yards. Out of the 18 players ahead of Ward on the NFL career receiving yards list, only Jerry Rice and Art Monk have multiple Super Bowl rings, and both are Hall of Famers.

In Week 5, Ward registered a team-high seven receptions for 54 yards with two touchdowns, his 16th career multi-touchdown game during the regular season and first since 11/9/09 at Denver (2). Ward now has 11,991 career receiving yards and needs nine yards to be the 18th player in NFL history to reach 12,000 receiving yards:

**Top Dawg: WR Hines Ward** leads the Steelers in at least 15 different career receiving categories.

Ward is the team's all-time leader in receiving yards (11,991), receptions (985) and receiving touchdowns (85).

Ward is the only wide receiver in Steelers history to be voted to four Pro Bowls. Ward's 1,167 receiving yards in 2009 made him the first Steelers receiver to reach 1,000 yards six times during his career with the team. No other Steeler has more than three.

Additionally, Ward has 29 career 100-yard receiving games, which is first on the team's all-time list.

In 2002, Ward became the first receiver in Steelers history to catch 100 passes (112) in a season. His 12 touchdown receptions in 2002 tied him with Louis Lipps (1985) and Buddy Dial (1961) for the highest single-season total in team history.

Ward was selected to the 2002-05 AFC Pro Bowl squads.

Currently there are only two players in NFL history to reach 12,000 receiving yards while playing for one team during their entire career (Marvin Harrison, Ind. and Steve Largent, Sea.).

In 2010, Ward became the first player in Steelers' history to reach 11,000 career receiving yards. Additionally, Ward, who has 967 career receptions, became just the 12th player in NFL history to record 900 receptions and 11,000 yards in a career.

**Hines Hanging Around:** WR Hines Ward has been with the Steelers since he was drafted in the third round in the 1998 NFL Draft. 2011 marks Ward's 14th season with the Steelers, which ties for the second longest tenure in team history behind Mike Webster, who played in Pittsburgh 15 years (1974-88). Ward owns the longest tenure among wide receivers with their current team.

Ward has 428 career rushing yards to mark the most by a Steelers wide receiver in team history.

Ward scored his first (and only) career rushing touchdown in 2004 against Philadelphia.

**100 Is the Number:** In Week 7, at Arizona, WR Mike Wallace gained 118 yards on three receptions, including a 95-yard touchdown, the longest reception and second longest offensive play from scrimmage in team history. It was Wallace's fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season.

He posted 100 yards receiving in each of the first three games this season, setting a franchise-best streak of six consecutive games with at least 100 yards receiving.

In Week 3 at Indianapolis, Wallace set a career high with 144 yards on five receptions, including an 81-yard touchdown. Dating back to 1991, Wallace's 129 yards on three receptions were the most by a Steelers' receiver in the first quarter.

In 2010, he posted his first career 1,000-yard season as he led all Steelers with 60 receptions, 1,257 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns, all career highs.

**Breakout Campaign:** WR Mike Wallace had a personal-best 10 receiving touchdowns in 2010. Through 11 games this season, Wallace has six touchdowns.

Wallace led the NFL with seven 100-yard receiving games in 2010, tying the team's regular-season record set by John Stallworth in 1984. Through 10 games in 2011, Wallace has four 100-yard receiving games.

**Going Deep:** WR Mike Wallace was one of the NFL's top deep threats last season, averaging a conference-best 21.0 yards per catch (2nd in NFL), after leading the NFL in receiving average as a rookie in 2009. Through 11 games in 2011, Wallace is averaging 17.1 yards per catch, tied for 11th highest in the NFL. Out of the 10 receivers with averages higher than Wallace, only one has over more receptions (Carolina Steve Smith, 59, 18.0 avg.).

Since entering the league in 2009, Wallace has averaged 19.2 yards per catch, which is third in the NFL over that time span (19.4, DeSean Jackson, Phi. and Anthony Armstrong, Was.) and has 38 receptions of 25+ yards, which is second to Jackson's league high 39.

So far in 2011, Wallace is tied for fourth in the NFL with 10 receptions of at least 25 yards (26, 28t, 29, 40, 40t, 48, 53, 81t, 95t, 25t). He had 26 receptions for at least 20 yards in 2010, the most for Pittsburgh since Hall of Famer John Stallworth had 24 in 1984.

Through 11 games in 2011, Wallace has six receptions of at least 40 yards, including a 81-yard touchdown at Indianapolis in Week 3 and a 95-yard touchdown in Week 7 at Arizona, which ranks as the second longest offensive play from scrimmage and the longest pass play in Steelers' history. Wallace registered a reception of at least 40 yards in six consecutive games this season (Games 2-7), the longest such streak in the NFL since Isaac Bruce in 2000 (Games 2-7).

**Miller Time: TE Heath Miller** has been a consistent performer for the Steelers throughout his career and that has continued this season. Miller is third on the team with 39 receptions for 485 yards and two touchdowns. He has registered at least one reception in all 11 games this season.

Miller recorded his best game of 2011 in Week 8 against New England, recording seven receptions for 85 yards. Miller got off to a fast start, registering four receptions on the first drive of the game to account for 55 of the Steelers 68 total yards on the touchdown drive. Miller tied a first half career-high with six receptions and set a first half career-high with 76 yards. Miller previously registered six receptions in the first half against San Diego on 10/4/09, totaling 58 yards. Dating back to 1991, Miller's six receptions tied Eric Green (6 for 118 yards, 9/22/91 vs. Philadelphia) for the most receptions by a Steelers' tight end in the first half.

Miller ranks second on the Steelers' all-time receptions list (325) and receiving yardage list (3,718) for tight ends. Miller trails Elbie Nickel in both (329 receptions, 5,133 receiving yards) on the team's all-time list for tight ends.

With 31 yards on three receptions in Week 10, Miller moved passed Roy Jefferson (3,671) for 10<sup>th</sup> place on the Steelers all-time receiving yards list with 3,698 career receiving yards.

Four receptions in Week 7 brought Miller to sixth place in Pittsburgh history, passing Franco Harris (306).

Miller has two touchdowns in 2011, giving him 31 for his career and making him the eighth Steelers player to record at least 30

receiving touchdowns. He is second on the team's all-time list for touchdowns by a tight end (Nickel, 37). After registering a touchdown in the Week 7 victory over Arizona, Pittsburgh improved 22-6 when Miller finds the end zone.

**Growing Up: WR Antonio Brown** is a second-year player that continues to get better as each game goes by. Last season he showed flashes of his ability late in the season and through out the postseason. In 2011 he is showing up on a more consistent basis on offense.

Over the last five games Brown has 30 receptions for 445 yards and one touchdown. Against Kansas City in Week 12, Brown recorded a team-high 81 yards on four receptions. In Week 10 he made his first career start and recorded five receptions for a team-high 86 yards. Including four receptions for 74 yards on a drive that traveled 77 yards in 15 plays and resulted in a field goal that gave Pittsburgh a 17-10 lead late in the second quarter. During the drive Brown converted two consecutive third downs for the Steelers: a 3<sup>rd</sup>-and-19 with a 21-yard reception and a 3<sup>rd</sup>-and-7 with a 15-yard reception.

Over the past five games Brown set career-highs in receiving yards: 109 on five receptions vs. Baltimore in Week 9, and receptions: nine for 67 yards versus New England in Week 8. After not registering a 100-yard receiving game in the 14 games of his career, Brown has two in the last four games (109 vs. Baltimore and 102 at Arizona).

Brown is tied for third in the NFL in third-down receptions, with 20 for 308 yards this season. Through 11 games, Brown ranks second on the Steelers with 707 yards on 48 receptions, shattering his rookie totals of 167 yards on 16 receptions in nine games played last season.

## INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE NOTES

**Timely Turnovers:** The Steelers have won the past two games by a combined 11 points, with both wins being sealed by timely interceptions late in the fourth quarter.

In Week 12 at Kansas City, **CB Keenan Lewis** recorded his first career interception at the Pittsburgh 14-yard line with 28 seconds remaining. Against Cincinnati in Week 10, **CB William Gay** came up with an interception at the Steelers 25-yard line with 2:33 left in the game.

Over the past two games Pittsburgh's defense has six takeaways (five interceptions and one fumble recovery) after only recording six (two interceptions, two fumble recoveries) in the first nine games this season.

**If There's a Will There's A Way: CB William Gay** returned to the starting lineup this season after serving as a nickel back for most of 2010. He has been an integral part of the Steelers third ranked pass defense. Through 11 games, Gay is second on the team with eight passes defended.

Gay registered his best game of the season in Week 10 at Cincinnati. He was part of a secondary that held the Bengals to 170 net passing yards and contributed two game-altering plays in the fourth quarter. With the Bengals on the Pittsburgh 47-yard line with 12:22 remaining, Gay deflected a pass into the hands of **LB Lawrence Timmons**. Later, with 2:33 left in the game and Cincinnati driving to the Steelers' 25-yard line, Gay jumped a route to intercept an Andy Dalton pass, returning it 12 yards to the Pittsburgh 31-yard line. From there, Pittsburgh ran out the clock for the seven-point win. It was Gay's second career interception.

**Mr. Versatility: LB Lawrence Timmons** has the ability to do many things for the Pittsburgh defense and so far in 2011 he has been utilized in many areas. Due to injuries Timmons has had to start four games at outside linebacker while starting seven at his



natural inside linebacker position. His versatility has helped the Steelers maintain a defense that ranks near the top of the NFL in many categories.

In Week 10 against the Bengals Timmons played his normal spot at inside linebacker and registered his fourth career interception, diving to pick off an Andy Dalton at the Steelers 33-yard line in the fourth quarter. It was the second consecutive year Timmons registered an interception at Cincinnati.

On the season Timmons is third on the team with 55 tackles, while also registering four quarterback hurries and four passes defensed.

**Power Of The Beard:** Over the past seven games, **DE Brett Keisel** has elevated his game to help lead an injury-plagued defensive unit. With multiple starters missing, the 10th-year pro has helped lead the defense since returning from his own injury on 10/9 vs. Tennessee, registering 26 tackles, three sacks, 22 quarterback pressures, six passes defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in the last seven games.

In Week 12 at Kansas City Keisel led the defensive line with two quarterback pressures, three tackles and one fumble recovery.

In Week 10 at Cincinnati Keisel tied with **LB James Farrior** to lead the Steelers front seven with six tackles. Keisel also recorded a team-high four quarterback pressures against the Bengals.

Against New England in Week 8, Keisel closed the game with a sack and forced fumble on QB Tom Brady. The fumble rolled all the way through the end zone for the Steelers' second safety in as many weeks. The previous week Keisel led the Steelers with five QB pressures at Arizona. In Week 6 versus Jacksonville, Keisel tied a career-high with two sacks for a loss of 16 yards, the fourth multi-sack game of his career and first since 11/9/09 vs. Denver (2.0). He also registered five tackles, four QB pressures and one pass breakup against the Jaguars.

Despite missing two games due to injury, Keisel leads the Steelers with 27 quarterback pressures this season.

**Man Of Troy:** **SS Troy Polamalu** has continued to make plays during the 2011 season as well as be a consistent force on the Steelers defense. Polamalu is second on the team with 65 tackles, including leading the team with 10 tackles at Cincinnati in Week 10. It marked his 13th career game with at least 10 tackles and second this season.

In Week 6 against Jacksonville, Polamalu stopped RB Maurice Jones-Drew for no gain on third-and-one in the fourth quarter, forcing the Jaguars to punt. In Week 4 versus Houston he led the Steelers with 10 tackles. In Week 3 at Indianapolis, Polamalu returned a fumble 16 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. In Week 2 he registered his first sack of 2011 and the ninth of his career versus Seattle.

Polamalu ranks fifth in Steelers' history among safeties in sacks. He is one shy of passing Chris Oldham (9.5) for fourth place in franchise history for the most sacks among safeties.

Polamalu, now has 27 career interceptions, the most of any active Steeler. The team is 22-3 when Polamalu has an interception.

**Harrison Back In Charge:** **LB James Harrison**, the 2008 NFL Defensive Player of the Year, has been a terror on opposing quarterbacks since he became the starting outside linebacker for the Steelers in 2007. One of the only things that has been able to stop him are injuries, as a hurt eye sidelined him for four games this season (Week 5-8).

Harrison returned to action in Week 9 versus Baltimore, registering three sacks and one forced fumble. It was Harrison's fourth regular-season game with at least three sacks and his 12<sup>th</sup> regular season game with at least two sacks. Including the postseason, Harrison has nine sacks against the Ravens, the most by any Steelers' player against Baltimore. The Steelers are 26-12 when he posts a sack.

**Climbing The Ranks:** With 54.0 career sacks **LB James Harrison** passed Greg Lloyd (53.5) for the fourth most by a Steelers' player since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

**Outside Presence:** **LB James Harrison** forced a fumble on a fourth-quarter sack of Ravens QB Joe Flacco in Week 9, giving Pittsburgh the ball at their own 42-yard line. In Week 3 Harrison forced a fumble on a sack that **SS Troy Polamalu** returned 16 yards for a touchdown to give Pittsburgh a 20-13 lead during a Week 3 victory over Indianapolis.

Harrison now has 26 forced fumbles in his career, ranking second in team history for career forced fumbles, behind only Greg Lloyd. The following is a list of the top seven career forced fumble leaders for the Steelers since 1987:

**Double Trouble:** The Steelers have a tradition of fielding some of the best pass-rushing linebackers in the NFL, and current linebackers **James Harrison** and **LaMarr Woodley** have

accounted for two of the top four sack totals by a Steelers' duo in team history.

Through 11 games in 2011, the two have combined for 14.0 sacks: Harrison (5.0) and Woodley (9.0) even though Harrison missed four games (Weeks 5-8) and Woodley missed three (Weeks 9-11) due to injuries.

In 2010, Harrison (10.5) and Woodley (10) combined for 20.5 sacks. They totaled 23.5 sacks between them (Woodley 13.5, Harrison, 10) in 2009.

In 2008, Harrison and Woodley broke the team's top sack duo record (since 1982) by combining for 27.5 sacks. The 27.5 sacks by Harrison (16) and Woodley (11.5) broke the record (24) previously held by Jason Gildon (13.5) and Joey Porter (10.5) in 2000 and Kevin Greene (14) and Greg Lloyd (10) in 1994.

**Double-Digit Duty: LB LaMarr Woodley (9.0) and LB James Harrison (5.0)** can become the first Steelers with at least 10 sacks in four consecutive seasons, dating back to 1982 when sacks became an official statistic.

Harrison became the first player in team history to post at least 10 sacks in three straight seasons as he had a team-best 10.5 in 2010.

Harrison posted 10 in 2009 and a career-best (team record) 16 in 2008.

Additionally, Woodley became just the second player in team history to post at least 10 sacks in three straight years as he finished with 10 in 2010. Woodley recorded 13.5 in 2009 and 11.5 in 2008.

**Making It Work:** Over the first 11 games of the season the Steelers have had to deal with injury issues on defense. Pittsburgh has used nine different starting lineups so far this season and still ranks second in the NFL in total defense and have allowed the fourth fewest points per game in the league.

In two of the past four games the Steelers have played without two of their starting linebackers, missing **LB James Farrior** and **LB James Harrison** against the Patriots and Farrior and **LB LaMarr Woodley** against Baltimore. Woodley also missed the Week 10 game at Cincinnati and the Week 12 matchup at Kansas City. Through 11 games this season the Steelers have only played four games with all four starting linebackers.

**Rising To The Occasion:** In Week 8 the highly ranked New England offense came to Heinz Field looking to duplicate past success. This year the Steelers defense answered the call.

The Steelers defense forced the Patriots to go three-and-out on their first possession, marking only the fourth time this season New England did not score on their first drive.

Pittsburgh held the Patriots to less than 20 points for the first time since 11/7/10 and for the only time this season. It was also only the second time in the previous 14 regular-season games that New England was held below 30 points.

Pittsburgh held Patriots QB Tom Brady to less than 200 yards passing for the first time this season. Steelers **LB LaMarr Woodley** sacked Brady twice, making him the first Steelers' player to record more than one sack in four consecutive games since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

The Steelers limited the Patriots to 43 yards rushing, New England's lowest output since being held to 22 yards rushing by Pittsburgh on 12/9/07. Dating back to 2000, three of the Patriots 10 lowest single-game rushing performances have come against the Steelers:

**Great First Half:** Before being sidelined with a hamstring injury suffered in Week 8 versus New England, **LB LaMarr Woodley** registered nine sacks through the first eight games. Despite missing the last three games, Woodley's nine sacks are tied for second in the AFC.

Nine sacks is the second most he has recorded in the first eight games of a season during his career (9.5, 2008). Woodley's nine sacks also marked the fourth highest total for a Steeler in the first half of a season since sacks became an official statistic in 1982:

**Bringing The Wood:** **LB LaMarr Woodley** has been a force defensively since he became a starter in 2008. The fifth-year linebacker is second in the AFC with nine sacks this season. Including the postseason, Woodley has recorded at least half a sack 12 times in the past 15 games he has played, totaling 15.5 sacks during the span.

Woodley recorded 1.5 sacks in Week 5 versus Tennessee and 2.0 sacks in Week 6 against Jacksonville, Week 7 at Arizona and Week 8 versus New England. It was the 16<sup>th</sup> regular season game of his career with at least 1.5 sacks. It marked the first time since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 that a Steelers' player registered at least 1.5 sacks in four consecutive regular season games. The last player in the NFL with more than one sack in four straight games was Simeon Rice in 2002 (five straight).

## INDIVIDUAL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

His sack in Week 1 at Baltimore marked the third time in the past four Kickoff Weekend games (2008, 2010, 2011) he recorded a sack.

Including the postseason, Woodley has recorded 22.0 sacks since the start of the 2010 season, tying for the fourth most in the NFL over that time span.

Woodley had posted at least a half-sack in 10 straight games, dating from 2009-10, and had 13.5 sacks during that span (Week 10 of 2009 through Week 2 of 2010). That span of 10 straight games broke the team's all-time record of six, previously held by Greg Lloyd in 1994.

**Elite Company: LB LaMarr Woodley** has registered 48.0 sacks in his first four-plus seasons with the Steelers, which ranks as the best start in franchise history and is the eighth most career sacks for a Steeler.

**All Good In The Hood: DE Ziggy Hood**, the team's No. 1 draft pick in 2009, started the final 10 games of 2010 in place of injured DE Aaron Smith and has filled in at both defensive end positions this season.

Over the past six games, Hood accounted for nine QB pressures, helping the Steelers defense register 14 total sacks during that time. In Week 5 versus Tennessee Hood tied a career-high with four QB pressures (11/21/10 vs. Oak).

Through 11 games in 2011, Hood has 20 tackles, a half a sack and is second on the team with 19 QB pressures.

He finished last season with 21 tackles and three sacks, which tied for the team-lead among defensive linemen (Keisel). He also led the defensive line unit with 17 QB pressures in 2010.

**Oh So Suisham:** In only 18 regular-season games as the Steelers kicker, **K Shaun Suisham** has already started to make his mark.

Suisham is now 10<sup>th</sup> all-time in franchise history by points as a kicker (140). He is 10<sup>th</sup> all-time in franchise history by field goals made (32).

He has the highest field goal percentage in the regular season (32-38, .842) of any kicker in team history. Only 10 players in team history have attempted more field goals than Suisham.

He's one of only two players to be perfect from 20-29 yards out, minimum 10 attempts (10-10 and Kris Brown is 20-20). His (.765%) from 40-49 yards out is the highest in team history (13-17). Only five players in team history have made more field goals than Suisham from 40-49 yards out.

**Coming Up Clutch: K Shaun Suisham** Connected on a 38-yard field goal with four seconds left in the fourth quarter to give Pittsburgh a 23-20 victory over Indianapolis in Week 3. It marked the fourth game-winning field goal of his career and second as a member of the Steelers.

**Return Success: WR Antonio Brown** has performed well in the return game. He ranks fourth in the AFC in punt returns (11.0 avg.) and third in the AFC kickoff returns (27.8 avg.).

On punt returns, he registered a career-long 41-yard return in Week 2 versus Seattle it marked the longest punt return by a Steeler since 11/5/07 (49 yards, Allen Rossum, vs. Baltimore). He followed it up with the second and third longest punt returns of his career over the next two weeks, 37 yards at Indianapolis and 33 yards at Houston. In Week 7 at Arizona, Brown averaged 23.5 yards on two punt returns, including a long of 31 yards.

Brown has also performed well on kick returns. Against Tennessee in Week 5, he registered the second longest kick return of his career (89-yard TD, 9/12/10 vs. Atl), a 52-yarder to the 50-yard line. In Week 1 against the Baltimore Ravens he returned three kickoffs for a total of 103 yards (31, 41 and 31 yards).

**Back Again:** For the second consecutive season **P Jeremy Kapinos** signed with the Pittsburgh Steelers on 11/5/11 to replace **P Daniel Sepulveda** who was placed on the Reserve/Injured list due to a knee injury.

Through three games this season, Kapinos has averaged 43.7 yards (36.6 net avg.) on 13 punts with a long of 57 yards while landing four inside the 20-yard line.

Last season Kapinos was signed in early December to fill in for the injured Sepulveda. In four regular season games in 2010, Kapinos averaged 41.1 yards per punt (32.3 net avg.) while averaging 48.0 yards per punt (38.5 net avg.) in three postseason contests.

Kapinos had a very good preseason this year, averaging 49.8 yards on nine punts (44.6 net avg.) with a long of 63 yards and four punts landing inside the 20-yard line.

## Preseason Game #1

Washington 16, Pittsburgh 7

Aug. 12, 2011

FedEx Field (68,320)

**LANDOVER, Md.** – For the first time since 2006, the Steelers lost their preseason opener, falling to the Washington Redskins, 16-7, at FedEx Field. The Steelers fell to 4-9 in the preseason when facing the Redskins on the road.

Neither team scored in the first quarter, but the Redskins had an opportunity on their opening drive of the game but K Shayne Graham missed a 29-yard field goal. Midway through the second quarter, QB Rex Grossman found WR Santana Moss for an eight-yard touchdown to give the Redskins a 7-0 lead. Grossman finished with a game-high 207 yards passing and one touchdown. Moss finished with a game-high seven receptions for 64 yards and one touchdown.

The Steelers answered Washington on their next possession. **RB Isaac Redman** broke free for a 22-yard touchdown run to tie the game, 7-7. Redman finished the game with five carries for 42 yards and one touchdown. But it would be the last points the Steelers would score. Prior to halftime, Graham missed another field goal, this time from 49 yards, and the teams went into halftime tied 7-7.

The Steelers only managed to gain 57 yards of offense in the second half, and only drove the ball into Redskins' territory once. The Redskins moved the ball well in the second half. Rookie RBs Evan Royster and Roy Helu combined for 88 rushing yards, while QB Kellen Clemens added 105 passing yards. K Graham Gano made three second-half field goals, from 32, 34 and 45 yards out, to seal the victory for the Redskins.

The Redskins gained 452 total yards of offense (312 passing, 140 rushing) to the Steelers' 186 yards of total offense (103 passing, 83 rushing). Washington's offense had 27 first downs, while the Steelers only had 12. The Redskins' defense added three sacks, while the Steelers' defense had zero. Washington also dominated the time of possession, holding the football for almost 20 minutes more than Pittsburgh.

**PITTSBURGH** – **QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **WR Antonio Brown** combined for two long touchdowns (77, 44) in the first half, and the Steelers cruised to a 34-16 victory against the Atlanta Falcons at Heinz Field. Pittsburgh is now 7-0 all time versus the Falcons in the preseason.

The Steelers wasted no time getting on the board, scoring only a minute and a half into the game. Brown took the opening kickoff back 51 yards and three plays later **RB Rashard Mendenhall** scored on a one-yard TD run. **LB Lawrence Timmons'** interception of QB Matt Ryan set up the Steelers second score, a **Shaun Suisham** 19-yard field goal, and the Steelers led 10-0.

The Falcons tied the game 10-10 on a field goal by K Matt Bryant and a 10-yard touchdown pass from Ryan to WR Roddy White. But the Steelers' offense kept rolling. Roethlisberger found Brown in the middle of the field for a 77-yard touchdown midway through the second quarter. With less than two minutes left in the half, Brown grabbed a 44-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger. Brown finished with a game-high 137 receiving yards and a game-high two touchdowns, while adding 109 kickoff return yards. Roethlisberger finished with 214 yards passing on just 11 completions and two touchdowns.

Bryant added a 46-yard field goal prior to halftime to cut the lead to 24-16. Neither team scored in the third quarter, but seconds into the fourth quarter, **CB Crezdon Butler** stepped in front of QB Chris Redman's pass and took it 95 yards for a touchdown to give the Steelers a 31-16 lead. **BALTIMORE** – The Steelers dropped their season opener for the first time since 2002, losing to the Baltimore Ravens at M&T Bank Stadium, 35-7. It was the largest margin of victory for the Ravens in the series history, thanks in large part to seven Steelers' turnovers.

It only took three plays for the Ravens to score their first touchdown. RB Ray Rice took the opening snap and rushed for 36 yards. Two plays later QB Joe Flacco found WR Anquan Boldin for a 27-yard touchdown and the Ravens led 7-0.

The Steelers first turnover came late in the first quarter when LB Terrell Suggs sacked and stripped the ball from **QB Ben Roethlisberger**. Suggs finished with a game-high three sacks. Rice then ran it in from one-yard out to put the Ravens up 14-0. The Steelers responded on their ensuing drive. Roethlisberger found **WR Emmanuel Sanders** for an 11-yard touchdown to cut the lead 14-7. But it would be the last points the Steelers would score.

Flacco and Rice hooked up for an 11-yard touchdown prior to halftime and the Steelers found themselves in a 14-point hole. On the Steelers' first play of the second half, Ravens' NT Haloti Ngata broke free and stripped the football from **RB Rashard Mendenhall**, setting the Ravens up at the Steelers' 16-yard line. On the very next play, Flacco found TE Ed Dickson for an 18-yard touchdown. Flacco finished the game 17-of-29 for 224 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions.

On the Steelers' very next offensive play, Roethlisberger was picked off by LB Ray Lewis. And on the Steelers ensuing drive, it looked as if they would find a way into the endzone, but Roethlisberger was intercepted by S Ed Reed. After Reed's interception, the Ravens marched right down the field and K Billy Cundiff connected on a 29-yard field goal.

Reed picked off Roethlisberger again in the fourth quarter, and the Steelers' **RB Mewelde Moore** was stripped by Lewis midway through the fourth quarter for the Steelers' seventh turnover. Cundiff connected from 30 yards out before the two-minute warning to give the Ravens the 35-7 victory.

Despite the turnovers, Roethlisberger finished with a game-high 280 yards passing. **WR Mike Wallace** also posted his ninth career 100-yard receiving game and fourth consecutive 100-yard game in the regular season. Wallace tied a career-high with eight receptions. **LB LaMarr Woodley** posted his 40th career sack, which tied him for 10th on the team's all-time list.

On the Steelers' opening drive, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** led the team to the Seattle one-yard line but the Seahawks held the Steelers on fourth-and-goal. The Steelers responded on their next drive when **RB Rashard Mendenhall** scored from one-yard out to put the Steelers up 7-0. Mendenhall finished with a game-high 66 yards rushing and one touchdown.

The Steelers scored their final points when Roethlisberger found **WR Mike Wallace** for a two-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter. Wallace tied a career-high with eight receptions for 126 yards and one touchdown. The 126 receiving yards were the second-highest total of his career. Wallace also surpassed 100+ yards receiving for the fifth consecutive regular-season game.

The Steelers defense did not budge against Seattle, only letting up 164 total yards (133 passing, 31 rushing). The 164 yards allowed are the third-lowest total since the start of the 2008 season. The defense added five sacks. **NT Steve McLendon** recorded his first career half-sack and **LB James Harrison** became just the seventh player in team history to reach 50 sacks with his sack of QB Tarvaris Jackson.

With the victory, Roethlisberger won his 70<sup>th</sup> game as a starting quarterback. Roethlisberger is now 5-0 in home openers.

**INDIANAPOLIS** – **K Shaun Suisham** nailed a 38-yard field goal with only four seconds left in the game to lift the Steelers to a 23-20 victory against the Indianapolis Colts at Lucas Oil Stadium. With the victory, the Steelers improved to 2-1 on the season. It marked the first victory for the Steelers in Indianapolis during the regular season since 1991.

The Steelers took the opening kickoff and went up 3-0 on Suisham's 48-yard field goal. Late in the first quarter, the Steelers took a 10-0 lead when **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **WR Mike Wallace** for an 81-yard touchdown, the longest reception in Wallace's career. Wallace finished the game with a career-high 144 yards receiving and one touchdown, extending his franchise record to six consecutive 100-yard receiving games.

The Colts scored 13 unanswered points, thanks in large part to three Steelers' turnovers. A Roethlisberger fumble set up K Adam Vinatieri's 21-yard field goal to cut the lead 10-3. And with less than two minutes remaining in the half, Roethlisberger was sacked and stripped and Colts' DE Jamaal Anderson scooped the ball up and returned it 47 yards for a touchdown. On the Steelers' ensuing drive, Roethlisberger was picked off and Vinatieri connected from 25 yards out to give the Colts a 13-10 lead at halftime.

The Steelers tied the game 13-13 early in the fourth quarter on Suisham's 44-yard field goal. Midway through the fourth quarter the Steelers' defense forced its first turnover of the season on **LB James Harrison's** sack and forced fumble. **S Troy Polamalu** picked up the loose ball and returned it 16 yards to give the Steelers a 20-13 lead.

The Colts though struck on their next drive. RB Joseph Addai scored from six yards out to tie the game 20-20. But there was plenty of time for the Steelers to score. Roethlisberger led the team on a 10-play, 60-yard drive that was capped off by Suisham's game-winning field goal. It was Roethlisberger's 24<sup>th</sup> game-winning/overtime drive of his career. Roethlisberger finished with a game-high 364 yards passing with one touchdown.

**HOUSTON** – RB Arian Foster scored on a 42-yard run midway through the fourth quarter to score the final points of a 17-10 victory for the Houston Texans over the Steelers at Reliant Stadium. With the loss, the Steelers fell to 2-2 on the season.

The Texans scored on their first possession as QB Matt Schaub led the team on a 19-play, 95-yard drive that was capped off by a one-yard touchdown toss to TE Owen Daniels.

K Neil Rackers added a 25-yard field goal late in the second quarter to give the Texans a 10-0 lead. The Steelers finally had some momentum on their final drive of the half. **K Shaun Suisham** attempted a 30-yard field goal, but it was blocked by S Daniael Manning. CB Johnathan Joseph then scooped up the loose football and returned 61 yards for a touchdown but the play was negated on a block in the back penalty. The Steelers trailed 10-0 at the half.

On the Steelers' first possession of the second half **QB Ben Roethlisberger** led the team on a 13-play, 74-yard drive that was capped by **RB Rashard Mendenhall's** three-yard touchdown run. The Steelers then tied the game, 10-10, when Suisham connected from 26 yards to begin the fourth quarter.

On the Texans' ensuing possession, Foster broke free and scored from 42 yards out. It was the longest run the Steelers' defense had given up since the 2006 season. Foster finished the game with 30 carries for 155 yards and one touchdown. The Steelers though had a chance to tie the game with less than a minute left, but Roethlisberger was picked off by CB Jason Allen.

The Texans rushed for 180 yards, which is the second-most rushing yards the Steelers' defense allowed in a game since the 2001 season. Foster's 155 rushing yards were the second-most by a running back against the Steelers' defense since 2001.

**WR Hines Ward** had one reception for 19 yards, giving him 11,838 career receiving yards, which puts him in 20<sup>th</sup> place in NFL History for receiving yards.

**PITTSBURGH** – **QB Ben Roethlisberger** threw for five touchdowns and **RB Jonathan Dwyer** ran for 107 yards, propelling the Steelers to a 38-17 victory over the Tennessee Titans at Heinz Field.

The Titans scored on their first possession of the game, marching 69 yards on 13 plays. K Rob Bironas connected from 29 yards out to put the Titans up 3-0.

The Steelers scored touchdowns on their first three possessions of the game. Roethlisberger found **TE Heath Miller** for an eight-yard touchdown pass to take a 7-3 lead. On the Steelers ensuing drive, Dwyer, on his first play of the season, raced down the sideline for a 76-yard run. It was the longest run of his career and it tied for the seventh longest run from scrimmage in Steelers' history. Later in the drive, Roethlisberger found **WR Hines Ward** for a seven-yard touchdown, and the Steelers led 14-3.

Roethlisberger threw his third touchdown of the day midway through the second quarter, finding **TE David Johnson** for a one-yard score. It was Johnson's first career touchdown, and the Steelers went into halftime up 21-3. The Steelers went up 28-3 when Roethlisberger connected with Ward on a five-yard touchdown pass. It was Ward's first multi-touchdown game of the season and 16<sup>th</sup> of his career. Ward finished with a game-high seven catches for 54 yards and two touchdowns.

The Titans cut the lead 28-10 on RB Chris Johnson's one-yard touchdown run but the Steelers answered. **K Shaun Suisham** extended the lead to 31-10 with a 19-yard field goal. Late in the fourth quarter the Titans cut the lead 31-17, when QB Matt Hasselbeck connected with WR Damian Williams on a 19-yard touchdown.

Roethlisberger threw his fifth touchdown pass of the game on the Steelers' next drive, finding **WR Mike Wallace** for a 40-yard score. It marked the second time in his career that he threw five touchdowns. Roethlisberger finished the game 24-of-34 for 228 yards with five touchdowns and one interception.

The Steelers' offense gained a season-high 431 total yards, including a season-high 174 yards rushing. The Steelers' defense held the Titans to 66 yards rushing, and had three sacks and one interception.

**PITTSBURGH** – RB Rashard Mendenhall returned to action after missing the previous week with a hamstring injury, and rushed for a season-high 146 yards, leading the Steelers to a 17-13 victory over the Jacksonville Jaguars at Heinz Field. With the win, the Steelers improved to 4-2 on the season, including a 3-1 record against the AFC South.

The Steelers wasted no time, scoring on their opening drive of the game. QB Ben Roethlisberger led the team on a 10-play, 87-yard drive, that was capped off by Mendenhall's eight-yard touchdown run. The Steelers scored again on their next drive, when Roethlisberger found WR Mike Wallace for a 28-yard touchdown. Wallace finished with a game-high 76 yards on two receptions, including a long of 48 yards. It marked the fifth straight game Wallace had a reception of 40+ yards.

K Shaun Suisham connected on a 21-yard field goal to give the Steelers a 17-0 lead. For the second consecutive game, the Steelers scored on their first three drives of the game. The Steelers' defense dominated the first half, holding the Jaguars to 68 total yards, while sacking QB Blaine Gabbert four times. The Jaguars found a way to score, when K Josh Scobee connected from 46 yards out, and the Steelers went into halftime with a 17-3 lead.

The Steelers offense failed to score in the second half, which allowed the Jaguars to chip away at the lead. **GLENDALE, Ariz.** – The Steelers won their third consecutive game, defeating the Arizona Cardinals 32-20 at the University of Phoenix Stadium. With the win, the Steelers improved to 5-2 on the season, including 2-0 against the NFC West.

The Steelers scored a touchdown on their first possession for the third straight game after S Ryan Clark intercepted QB Kevin Kolb off a tipped pass to set the Steelers up at the Cardinals 31-yard line. Five plays later, QB Ben Roethlisberger found TE Heath Miller for a 12-yard score, and the Steelers led 7-0.

Midway through the second quarter, Roethlisberger and WR Mike Wallace connected on a 95-yard touchdown reception. It was the longest pass play in Steelers' history and second-longest play from scrimmage in team history. Wallace has now recorded one reception of at least 40 yards in six consecutive games, which is the longest streak in the NFL since Isaac Bruce in 2000. Wallace finished with a game-high 118 yards receiving and one touchdown.

With the Steelers up 14-0, the Cardinals answered with a 13-play 80-yard drive that was capped off by a one-yard run by RB Alfonso Smith to cut the lead 14-7. The Steelers went into halftime with a 17-7 lead when K Shaun Suisham connected on a 41-yard field goal as time expired.

The Cardinals cut the lead 17-14 when Kolb found RB LaRod Stephens-Howling for a 73-yard touchdown. But the Steelers put the game out of reach on their next three drives. Roethlisberger found WR Emmanuel Sanders for a four-yard touchdown to put the Steelers up 24-14. Then the Steelers registered a safety, their first since the 2008 season. LB LaMarr Woodley pressured Kolb in the end zone and Kolb was flagged for intentional grounding.

Suisham added two field goals in the fourth quarter (42, 39) to give the Steelers a 32-14 lead. The Cardinals added one score late in the fourth quarter.

Roethlisberger finished the game 26-of-39 for 361 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions, guiding the Steelers' offense to a season-high 445 total yards. Woodley added two sacks, marking the second time in his career that he's had three consecutive multi-sack games.

**PITTSBURGH** – The Steelers won their fourth straight contest, defeating the New England Patriots 25-17 at Heinz Field. With the win, the Steelers improved to 6-2 on the season.

The Steelers scored a touchdown on their opening drive for the fourth straight game as they drove 68 yards on 11 plays. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **RB Mewelde Moore** for a five-yard touchdown to give the Steelers a 7-0 lead. Roethlisberger finished the game with a season-high 365 passing yards and two touchdowns.

The Steelers increased their lead to 10-0 when **K Shaun Suisham** connected on a 33-yard field goal. Roethlisberger looked poised to add to the lead but he was picked off by LB Gary Guyton. Guyton's interception set the Patriots up at the Steelers eight-yard line. Two plays later QB Tom Brady found WR Deion Branch for a two-yard touchdown to cut the lead 10-7.

Roethlisberger answered on the ensuing drive, finding **WR Antonio Brown** for a seven-yard touchdown to give the Steelers a 17-7 lead. Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski added a 46-yard field goal prior to halftime to cut the lead 17-10.

The Steelers offense continued to control the clock after halftime. Suisham added two field goals (21, 23) to give the Steelers a 23-10 lead. The Patriots made the last few minutes of the fourth quarter very interesting. Brady found TE Aaron Hernandez for a one-yard score to cut the lead to 23-17. The Patriots inside kick attempt failed but the Steelers were unable to run out the clock. That left Brady with less than 30 seconds to work.

The Steelers defense sealed the win when **DE Brett Keisel** sacked Brady and forced a fumble. The ball rolled through the end zone and out of bounds for a safety. **LB LaMarr Woodley** added two sacks, becoming the first player in team history to register at least 1.5 sacks in four consecutive regular-season games. The Steelers defense held the Patriots to season-lows in total net yards (213), passing yards (198) and points (17).

The Steelers offense totaled 427 total yards (329 passing and 98 rushing), while controlling the football for almost 40 minutes.

**PITTSBURGH** – For the second consecutive year, QB Joe Flacco threw the game-winning touchdown at Heinz Field, this time to WR Torrey Smith, and the Ravens beat the Steelers 23-20. The Steelers dropped to 6-3 on the season.

On the opening drive of the game, the Ravens traveled 74 yards in 14 plays to set up an 18-yard field goal by K Billy Cundiff to take a 3-0 lead. **K Shaun Suisham** tied the game with a 36-yard field goal early in the second quarter.

Both teams exchanged field goals as Cundiff made a 43-yarder midway through the second quarter and Suisham connected from 30 yards out with only one minute left in the half. Cundiff connected on a 51-yarder as the clock expired, and the Ravens led 9-6 at halftime.

LB Terrell Suggs picked off **QB Ben Roethlisberger** when the Steelers were driving early in the second half. The Ravens went up 16-6 on their ensuing drive when Rice scored from four yards out. The Steelers got right back into the game when **RB Rashard Mendenhall** scored on a one-yard run to cut the lead to 16-13. On the Ravens next drive, **LB James Harrison** forced a fumble on a sack of Flacco and **CB William Gay** fell on the loose ball. Harrison finished the game with three sacks in his first game back in more than one month.

Roethlisberger led his team on a six-play, 58-yard drive that was capped off by a 25-yard touchdown toss to **WR Mike Wallace**. Roethlisberger finished with 330 yards passing, becoming the only quarterback in Steelers' history to throw for 300+ yards in three consecutive regular-season games.

The Steelers defense held the Ravens on their next possession but the Steelers were unable to add to their total. They pinned the Ravens on their own eight-yard line with 2:24 left in the game. That's when Flacco led his team on a 13-play 92-yard drive that was capped by the 26-yard touchdown pass to Smith in closing seconds.

**KANSAS CITY – CB Keenan Lewis'** interception of Chiefs' QB Tyler Palko late in the fourth quarter sealed the 13-9 Steelers' victory against the Kansas City Chiefs at Arrowhead Stadium. The Steelers improved to 8-3 on the season and remained tied for first place in the AFC North.

Palko led the Chiefs on an 11-play, 57-yard drive set up K Ryan Succop for a 41-yard field goal on the opening drive of the game to put the Chiefs up 3-0. The Steelers marched the ball right down the field on their ensuing possession, but **RB Mewelde Moore** fumbled and the Chiefs recovered the football in the end zone.

On the ensuing drive the Steelers' defense came up big when **DE Brett Keisel** recovered a Palko fumble. On the Chiefs' next possession, **CB Ike Taylor** picked off Palko. **K Shaun Suisham** hit a 21-yard field goal to tie the game 3-3. **S Ryan Mundy** picked off Palko on the Chiefs' next possession. It was Mundy's first career interception.

The Steelers then marched right down the field. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **TE Weslye Saunders** for a two-yard touchdown to give the Steelers a 10-3 lead. It was Saunders' first career touchdown reception. Roethlisberger finished the game with 193 yards passing and one touchdown.

Late in the second quarter, Succop connected on a 49-yard field goal to cut the lead to 10-6. But as the halftime whistle sounded, Suisham connected on a 49-yard field goal of his own to give the Steelers a 13-6 lead going into the break.

Though the Steelers' offense did not score a point in the second half, the Steelers' defense repeatedly shut down the Chiefs. Succop was able to make a 40-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter but it was too little, too late.
